## **2001 Annual Data User Conference: Meeting the Challenges of the Future through Information Resources and Technology**

MIDDLETOWN, PA— The Pennsylvania State Data Center, located at Penn State Harrisburg, is hosting its annual Data User Conference on Tuesday, September 11, 2001 at the Holiday Inn Grantville. The Conference is designed to educate a diverse audience on ways to meet the challenges of the future through information resources and technology. Along with a plenary session, luncheon, and keynote, the day will include 20 breakout sessions with special emphasis on Census 2000 data.

This year's Plenary speaker will be John Haaga, Director of Domestic Programs for the Population Research Bureau, Washington, D.C. Mr. Haaga will be speaking on demographic trends, the link between demographic data and public policy.

The lunch and keynote speaker will be Daniel Shostak, futurist, social scientist and founder of SAFIRE International (Strategy, Assessment, Futures and Intelligence Research). Mr. Shostak will be speaking on the future of technology. His expertise concentrates on providing strategic intelligence to organizations and individuals aspiring to create health, empower the public, generate sustainable wealth, improve the quality of life and secure justice.
