
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1997-2001 Industry Trends Report Now Available

MIDDLETOWN, Pa – The number of businesses in Pennsylvania continues to increase, according to the report *Pennsylvania County Industry Trends 1997-2001* produced by the Pennsylvania State Data Center at Penn State Harrisburg. This report was produced in partnership with Penn State University's Technical Assistance Program (PENNTAP), the Center for Workforce Information and Analysis, and Verizon.

The data in this report show the number of business establishments in Pennsylvania in the second quarter 2001 stood at 328,996. Between 1997 and 2001, the number of business establishments in the state increased by 41,945, an increase of 14.6 percent.

Eight counties, Forest (29.5 percent), Bucks (27.8 percent), Sullivan (22.0 percent), Fayette (21.8 percent), Mercer (21.4 percent), Chester (21.0 percent), Fulton (20.7 percent) and Washington (20.7 percent) saw their number of establishments rise by at least 20 percent. A total of nine counties experienced a growth of more than 1,000 new establishments. Bucks County had the highest increase with 4,277 new establishments. Montgomery County was second with 4,000 new establishments. No county in Pennsylvania experienced a decline in the number of business establishments from 1997-2001. Schuylkill County has the smallest percent increase in the number of establishments at 2.3 percent while Cameron County had the smallest increase in raw numbers with 11 new establishments.

Seven counties in Pennsylvania had over 10,000 establishments each, accounting for over 45 percent of the total business establishments in Pennsylvania in 2001. The top three counties in Pennsylvania in terms of total business establishments in 2001 were Allegheny (35,622), Montgomery (28,434) and Philadelphia (27,428). The three counties with the smallest business establishments in Pennsylvania in 2001 were Forest (167), Cameron (170) and Sullivan (222).

While the total number of business establishments increased by 14.6 percent in Pennsylvania between the second quarters of 1997 and 2001, total employment increased by 5.9 percent. In 2001, Pennsylvania employment totaled 5,598,728 persons or an increase of 314,137 employees from 1997. Montgomery County showed the largest increase in employment numbers with a gain of 39,605 jobs, followed by Allegheny (36,316) and then Chester (24,106). Overall, seven counties had an employment increase of over 10,000 persons. Three counties, Potter (37.2), Monroe (17.0) and Forest (16.6), saw employment increase by more than 15 percent. Seven counties in Pennsylvania experienced a decrease in employment between 1997 and 2001 with Elk County showing the largest drop of -3.6 percent or 599 jobs.

The growth in the number of business establishments in Pennsylvania in the 1997-2001 periods was not shared equally among industrial sectors. For example, the mining sector gained only 49 business establishments between 1997 and 2001, while the service industry gained 20,259 establishments.

The service industry had the largest increase with a growth of 20,259 establishments between 1997 and 2001 followed by the retail trade industry with an increase of 5,278 establishments. As far as employment, two of the ten major industry sectors showed a decrease in employment in the 1997 to 2001 period. These were: manufacturing (-41,699) and mining (-1,567). The industries showing the largest gains in employment in Pennsylvania in the 1997 to 2001 period were: services (203,745), retail trade (53,453) and construction (35,758). Six sectors saw increases of over 10,000 employees and two sectors saw increases of less than 5,000 employees during this time period.

The economy in Pennsylvania is becoming more reliant upon jobs in service. In 60 counties in Pennsylvania in 2001, 1 of every 4 employed persons was working in the



service industry. In 31 counties, 1 of every 3 persons had a job in the service industry. In Montour County, 1 of every 2 jobs is in the service industry.
