## **Pennsylvania German Population Featured in Census Bureau's Summary File 4 Release**

MIDDLETOWN, Pa – The Pennsylvania State Data Center at Penn State Harrisburg reports that the U.S. Census Bureau has today released the Census 2000 Summary File 4 (SF4) data for Pennsylvania. This release presents population, housing and socio-economic data down to the census tract level. The Summary File 4 data release is compiled from responses to the long-form questionnaire and features topics from the short-form questionnaire.

Summary File 4 data is repeated or iterated for the total population and 335 additional population groups: 132 race groups, 78 American Indian and Alaska Native tribe categories, 39 Hispanic or Latino groups and 86 ancestry groups. Data is available for population groups that have at least 50 unweighted sample cases in a specific geographic area. Like the Summary File 2 release, tables will be excluded from Summary File 4 when a group's total population falls below a specific threshold of 100. As a result, not all racial groups, ethnicities and ancestries may be available for Pennsylvania.

An example of an ancestry group in Pennsylvania would be the Pennsylvania German population. This group is also known as the Pennsylvania Dutch, derived from the word 'Deutsch', which means 'German'. The Pennsylvania German population is a large source of tourism for the Commonwealth. A great deal of their merchandise can be found across Pennsylvania in fairs, markets, stores and other retail outlets. The following counties did not meet the population thresholds for the Pennsylvania German ancestry in 2000: Beaver, Cameron, Elk, Forest, Fulton, Greene, Juniata and Sullivan. As a result, data was not available for this ancestry group in those counties.

A total of 130,781 Pennsylvanians, 1.1 percent of the state's population, reported a Pennsylvania German ancestry in 2000 (Table 1). Lehigh County (6.2 percent) had the highest percentage of its population reporting this ancestry. Carbon County (5.3 percent) and Northampton County (4.8 percent) had the next highest percentage of its populations reporting a Pennsylvania German ancestry. Eighteen of the 67 counties in Pennsylvania reported populations of Pennsylvania German ancestry greater than 2,000 persons.

There were 54,780 households reporting any Pennsylvania German ancestry in Pennsylvania in 2000. This represents 0.1 percent of all the households in the Commonwealth in 2000. Of all the Pennsylvania households reporting a Pennsylvania German ancestry in 2000, there were 40,465 households reporting ownership of their own home while 14,315 households reported that they were renting their home.

The median family income of the Pennsylvania population reporting a Pennsylvania German ancestry was \$44,115 in 1999 (Table 2). The median family income of all Pennsylvanians was \$49,184 in 1999.
