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## Pennsylvania County Industry Trends, 2001-2003 Report Now Available

MIDDLETOWN, Pa –The Pennsylvania State Data Center at Penn State Harrisburg announces the release of *Pennsylvania County Industry Trends*, 2001-2003. *Pennsylvania County Industry Trends*, 2001-2003 provides information on business establishments and average monthly employment for the second quarter of the years 2001 through 2003 by county and industrial sector. The data in this report applies only to employers covered under Pennsylvania's Unemployment Compensation Law. These employers account for about 95 percent of all of Pennsylvania's nonagricultural wage and salary employment.

This report was produced by the Pennsylvania State Data Center in partnership with Penn State University's Technical Assistance Program (PENNTAP), Team Pennsylvania Foundation and the Center for Workforce Information and Analysis.

The total number of business establishments in Pennsylvania increased from 315,349 in 2002 to 321,048 in 2003, an increase of 1.8 percent (Table 2). This reversed the trend from 2001 to 2002 when the number of businesses declined for the first time in over a decade. Overall, there were 51 Pennsylvania counties that showed an increase in the total number of establishments from 2002 to 2003. Philadelphia County (4.3 percent) posted the largest percentage increase and had the largest numerical increase in businesses as well, 1,102.

Nine counties--Allegheny, Philadelphia, Montgomery Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Lancaster, Westmoreland and Berks --accounted for over 50 percent of the total business establishments in the commonwealth in 2003. The counties with the largest number of establishments in 2003 were Allegheny (35,652), Philadelphia (26,987) and Montgomery (26,807). These counties either contain or border the two most populated cities in the state, Pittsburgh and Philadelphia.

The total number of employees in Pennsylvania decreased 0.7 percent from 5,542,924 employees in 2002 to 5,504,984 employees in 2003, a difference of 37,940 total employees. Twenty-eight of the sixty-seven counties in Pennsylvania increased their total number of employees from 2002 to 2003. Pike County (7.1 percent) and Union County (4.0 percent) showed the highest percentage increases in the number of employees in the state between 2002 and 2003. Pike County has had the highest percent increase for two years in a row. Bucks County has the highest numeric increase in the number of employees from 2002 to 2003, 3,271. Butler County was second at 1,336.

There were 44,870 retail trade establishments in Pennsylvania in 2003 (Table 1), which accounted for the largest number of establishments in an industry sector in the commonwealth. The Other Services (except Public Administration) industry had the largest increase in the number of establishments (1,065) between 2002 and 2003 followed by the Professional, Scientific and Professional Services industry with an increase of 1,000. Statewide, eleven of the twenty major industry sectors showed a decrease in employment in the 2002 to 2003 time period. The industries showing the largest gains in employment in Pennsylvania were: Health Care and Social Assistance (10,765), Educational Services (9,338), Management of Companies and Enterprises (5,895) and Finance and Insurance (3,020).
