Irish-American Heritage Month (March) & St. Patrick's Day (March 17)

MIDDLETOWN, Pa – Although not an "official" holiday in the United States, St. Patrick's Day has a long history of being celebrated with parades and general goodwill for all things Irish. There are many parades scheduled throughout the state, including one in Harrisburg on Saturday, March 19 at 2:00 p.m.

The day commemorates St. Patrick, who introduced Christianity to Ireland in the fifth century. Because many Americans celebrate their Irish lineage on St. Patrick's Day, March was selected as Irish-American Heritage Month and proclaimed by Congress in 1995.

The Pennsylvania State Data Center at Penn State Harrisburg reports that data from Census 2000 shows that the total number of people who claimed a first ancestry of Irish in Pennsylvania was 1,241,584, or 10.1 percent of the state's population At the county level, Philadelphia County had the highest number of people who claimed a first ancestry of Irish, 150,216 while Delaware County had the highest percent of people who claimed Irish as their first ancestry, 21.4. Please note that in answering the question in regards to ancestry on the Census questionnaire, respondents were allowed to select multiple ancestries. There were also 1,595 people who claimed Celtic as their first ancestry in Pennsylvania. Table 1 provides data on those persons who reported a first ancestry of Irish or Celtic at the state and county level.

Some interesting facts about Pennsylvania and things Irish are:

- ♣ In 2002, Pennsylvania imported 16.7 million in goods from Ireland and exported 17.4 million in goods to the country.
- ♣ There are six localities in Pennsylvania named Irishtown, however the U.S. Census Bureau does not recognize these areas and no Census data is available for these geographies.
- ♣ On St. Patrick's Day, some Pennsylvania drinking establishments offer greendyed beer to their thirsty patrons. However, the per-capita annual consumption of



beer and malt liquor among drinking-age Pennsylvania residents has declined to less than 23 gallons per person--the lowest consumption rate since 1947.
