Census Bureau Releases 2004 State and County Population Estimates by Sex, Age, Race and Hispanic Origin for Pennsylvania

MIDDLETOWN, Pa – The U.S. Census Bureau has released July 1, 2004 estimates of the population based on sex, age, race and Hispanic origin. The release includes detailed estimates for Pennsylvania at the state and county levels. In 2004, Pennsylvania's estimated population rose to 12,406,292, an increase of 125,238 persons since 2000.

Age and Sex

Since 2000, Pennsylvania's elderly population (65 years or older) has continually declined, dropping by 22,663 persons. The state's elderly population again decreased this year, from 1,900,491 in 2003 to 1,896,503 in 2004. Sullivan County had the highest percentage of elderly persons in the commonwealth, with 22.5 percent of its estimated 2004 population being 65 years or older, while Allegheny is estimated to have the largest numeric population of elderly (215,799). The estimated population of persons under the age of 18 also declined, down from 2,922,221 in 2000 to 2,837,009 in 2004; this age group now comprises 22.9 percent of the population.

As of July 1, 2004, the commonwealth's male (6,013,662) and female (6,392,630) populations stood at 48.5 percent and 51.5 percent of the total population, respectively. Philadelphia County had both the largest estimated number and highest estimated percentage of women in the commonwealth in 2004. An estimated 785,846 women lived in Philadelphia in 2004, accounting for 53.5 percent of the county's total population.

Race and Hispanic Origin

The population in the White Alone (86.2 percent), Black or African American Alone (10.5 percent) and Asian Alone (2.2 percent) racial groups accounted for 98.9 percent of the total estimated population in Pennsylvania in 2004. There were 475,552 persons of Hispanic or Latino ethnicity in the commonwealth in 2004, 3.9 percent of Pennsylvania's total population.* (Table 1)

At the county level, Phildadelphia has the highest percentages of both Black or African American Alone (51.0 percent of the state's total Black Alone population) and Asian Alone (28.5 percent of the state's Asian Alone population) estimated populations in 2004. Philadelphia County remains the most populous county in Pennsylvania. Philadelphia is also home to the highest percentage of persons claiming the Hispanic or Latino Ethnicity (31.3 percent of the state's Hispanic population). The White Alone population remained the largest single racial group in every county in the commonwealth.



Methodology

PENNSTATE

The Census Bureau used a distributive cohort component method to develop the July 1, 2004 state estimates of the resident population by age, sex, race, and Hispanic origin, for all of the nation's states and counties. Using previously developed resident state population estimates by age and sex, and resident national population estimates by age, sex, race, and Hispanic origin, the Census Bureau estimated the age, sex, race, and Hispanic origin distributions for each state by estimating post-censal change in the corresponding populations with a cohort component model. The distributions were then applied to the original state age-sex and national characteristics estimates.
