

Pennsylvania Black-Owned Businesses Grow to Almost 25,000

MIDDLETOWN, Pa — Black-owned businesses in Pennsylvania increased 25.1 percent between 1997 and 2002, according to a newly released U.S. Census Bureau report, **2002 Survey of Business Owners: Black-Owned Firms**. The growth rate of the commonwealth's Black-owned firms was more than 5 times the state average for all businesses (4.4 percent). More than 4,900 Black-owned firms have been added since 1997, bringing the total to 24,757. In contrast to Pennsylvania businesses as a whole, black-owned establishments have experienced steady growth since 1992.

Black-owned firms accounted for just 2.8 percent of all Pennsylvania establishments in 2002, but roughly twenty-eight out of every 1,000 Black (Alone) adults (18+) owned their own business. Revenue generated by African-American establishments grew more slowly than the number of firms, increasing 6.2 percent (\$124.4 million) between 1997 and 2002, well below the 25 percent growth by Black firms nationally. increase in number of Blackowned firms was also about 20



percent lower than the national average. Black-owned establishments in Pennsylvania took in a total of \$2.1 billion in 2002 and employed more than 20,000 workers with a combined payroll of \$508 million. Eighty-nine percent (22,096) of Pennsylvania Black-owned firms had no paid employees.

Black-owned Businesses by Industry

In 2002, roughly 1-in-5 Black-owned establishments (5,682) in Pennsylvania operated in the health care and social assistance industry, followed by other services (3,659), and professional, scientific, and technical services (2,840) businesses. African Americans were least represented in mining (5) management of companies and enterprises (5) and utilities (11) industries. Regarding firms with paid employees, Black accommodation and food services (4,413), health care and social assistance (3,809), and administrative and support and waste management and remediation



service (3,804) businesses were the largest employers. Manufacturing (\$328.8 million) and health care and social assistance (\$322.2 million) firms generated the most revenue.

Selected Counties

Philadelphia (10,576), Allegheny (3,486), Delaware (2,277), and Montgomery (1,842) counties led selected Pennsylvania counties with 100 or more Black-owned businesses. Philadelphia also ranked 8th nationally among cities with the largest number of Black-owned firms compared to all firms in the state. Forty-three percent of all Black-owned firms in Pennsylvania were located in Philadelphia, and ten Pennsylvania counties were home to 300 or more Black-owned businesses. Philadelphia businesses generated by far the most revenue (\$848.7 million), and the combined sales and receipts from businesses in Allegheny (\$301.8 million) and Philadelphia accounted for 54.3 percent of all revenue taken in by Black establishments. On average, Black establishments in Erie County generated the most revenue, about \$279,000 per business –well above the state average of \$86,000. Of the selected counties, the fewest businesses were reported in Erie (179), Washington (165), and Westmoreland (119) counties. (Table 1)

Selected Places

Of selected Pennsylvania places with more than 100 Black-owned firms, Philadelphia had more than six times the number of businesses of the next closest places; Pittsburgh (1,733), Harrisburg (544), and Cheltenham (404). Five other places had more than 200 Black-owned firms. After Philadelphia, Black businesses in Pittsburgh (\$143 million) and Erie (\$46.9 million) generated the most revenue. (Table 2)

Selected Metropolitan, Micropolitan, and Combined Statistical Areas

More than 16,000 Black-owned businesses were reported in metropolitan Philadelphia in 2002. In the Harrisburg-Carlisle-Lebanon Combined Statistical Area, 1,160 establishments were reported, and 255 were located in the York-Hanover-Gettysburg Combined Statistical Area. More than 800 Black-owned firms were located in the Allentown-Bethlehem-Easton, PA-NJ Metropolitan Statistical Area, 203 in the Lancaster MSA, and 179 were reported in the Erie MSA. The East Stroudsburg Micropolitan Statistical Area had 424 Black-owned businesses in 2002.
