

Growth of Pennsylvania Housing Units in 2006

MIDDLETOWN, Pa – According to new estimates released today by the U.S. Census Bureau, Pennsylvania's housing units grew to 5,453,228 in 2006, ranking the Commonwealth 5th among all states in number of housing units. Between July 1, 2005 and July 1, 2006, Pennsylvania gained 30,644 housing units, a 0.6 percent increase. Since 2000, the number of housing units has increased by 203,477, a 3.9 percent increase. The Commonwealth ranks 45th among the states in percent increase between 2000 and 2006 (3.9 percent). In terms of percent, Pennsylvania housing has grown about half as fast as the nation over the last five years (see chart).



Pennsylvania Counties

None of Pennsylvania's counties ranked among the top 100 nationally in percent growth of housing units between 2005-2006 and 2000-2006. Montgomery County (+2,991) led all counties in the number of housing units gained in 2006, followed by York (+2,715) and Chester (+2,710) Counties. Warren, Elk, Cameron, Forest, McKean, Indiana and Fayette Counties all lost housing units between 2005 and 2006. Pike (+2.5), Monroe (+2.0), Franklin (+1.6) and York (+1.6) led all counties in percent growth from 2005-2006.



Chester (+17,715) led Pennsylvania counties in the number of housing units gained since 2000, followed by York (+14,870) and Montgomery (14,295) Counties. Philadelphia (-1,573 units, or -0.2 percent) was the only county to lose housing units since 2000. Monroe (+14.2 percent) and Pike (13.0 percent) Counties had the highest percent increases since 2000 (see Table 1).

More about Housing Unit Estimates

Housing unit estimates use building permits, mobile home shipments, and estimates of housing unit loss to update housing unit change since the last census. Census counts of housing units are geographically updated each year to reflect legal changes reported in the Boundary and Annexation Survey (BAS), Census corrections, and other administrative revisions. The reference date for estimates is July 1.
